

We offer the following five program choices:


- 1) Preschool

- 3) BlendEd
- 4) Online
- 5) Home Education

All of our programs require a significant commitment from parents. Students must have an engaged adult who is available daily to assist, support, transport and coordinate learning activities for the student.

Phoenix is a secular school and celebrates a variety of commercial holidays! We respect diversity and parents' right to choice!

Phoenix is not a designated special needs school and as such we cannot accommodate severe special needs students. Due to limited funding and resources, we are *unable* to accommodate...

- Students with behavioral challenges, oppositional defiance or a history of aggression or physical violence.
- Students who require 1:1 aides, nursing staff or special intervention equipment or providers (unless providing your own).
- Students who may be a flight risk or danger to themselves or others.



Our mission is to provide unique learning opportunities for families so that each young person may develop into a lifelong learner and active responsible global citizen.

Each educational program is customized to suit your child's specific needs, learning styles and the environment.



EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS SUMMARY GR. K-6



Kindergarten (K) – Open to children who are 4 years and 8 months old on September 1 of each year. Consists of a minimum of 475 hours of programming including music, art, literacy and field trips. Field trip, food or cultural fees may be charged if applicable. Families receive ~\$703* towards transportation. This is an onsite program and regular attendance is required.

BlendEd (Gr. 1-9) - Our "BlendEd" program uses our learning management system (Schoology), along with great print resources, onsite small group classes, field trips and school-based activities for 950-1000 hours for Grades 1-9. This hybrid program follows the Alberta Program of Studies (APS) in all subject areas. An Alberta certificated teacher called a Learning Coach develops the instructional path, delivers the learning opportunities, coaches and assesses your student.



Parents must be highly engaged partners in this learning path and it is truly a collaborative effort between the home and the school, combining the strengths of parent-student, student-teacher, and parent-teacher interaction. The degree to which parents are engaged in learning partnerships varies with the age of the student, the learning needs and the grade level.

This program includes all the core resources, classes, field trips, activities, testing, support etc. needed for completion of the basic instructional pathway. Transportation Grant may be available (\$492.00*)

Online (Gr. 1-6) - This program is suited to students who cannot make it into Phoenix on a regular basis. Just like the BlendEd program, all the resources are provided, including self-directed field trips. A Phoenix teacher still develops the instructional path, delivers the learning opportunities, coaches and assesses your student. The primary difference between the two programs is that all of the programs are provided online and instead of onsite classes and workshops, students "see teachers" online through conference sessions.

<u>Home Education (Gr.K-9)</u> – In a Home Education program, the parent designs, implements and evaluates the program. A Phoenix teacher reports on the progress of the program. Minimum 2 parent/student/teacher meetings each year. Portfolio required. Resource funding allotment is ~\$901.00* Please see our handbook for what kinds of items can be reimbursed.

HOW MONDAY WORKS

Mondays are for Extras/ Supports. This includes programs such as Flight School and Reading Eggs. We also offer a variety of supports such as OT, PT and Speech therapy. Private schools are not obligated to admit every student who seeks admission. However, once accepted, we have an obligation to provide access to appropriate programming based on the student's needs, our model, and the level of service we have the ability to provide. Phoenix does not receive special needs funding for mild, moderate, online, or home education students. Some BlendEd students qualify for severe special needs funding based on eligibility that is determined by Alberta Education. School authorities may use the funding they receive based on the needs of these students within their school community.

Flight School

Is our remedial program designed to assist our special needs students as they soar to Brilliance. This program is by teacher-invite only, and is taught by the creative and clever staff from Renfrew Support Services. It runs MONDAYS for 16 WEEKS. This program is offered ONSITE only.

Reading Chicks Program

Does your student find reading difficult? Would they benefit from direct and intensive instruction with our Reading Coach? Reading Eggs is designed to assist struggling readers in overcoming hurdles and closing the gap between grade and reading level.

Our Reading Eggs Program offers evidence-based instruction customized to each student's needs. It runs MONDAYS for 14 weeks (2 parent sessions and 12 student sessions) for 45 minutes in a small group setting (maximum 4 students of similar reading levels). Students can register for both sessions - FALL and/ or WINTER. Fee: \$80.00 per session for Phoenix registered students, \$160 for non-registered kids.

Group availability depends on applicants of the same age and literacy needs. Assessments must be completed by the teacher prior to placement. This program is offered ONSITE only.

- Fall start date: Oct 7 Parent info, Oct 28 Student begins
- Winter start date: Feb 24 Parent info, March 10 Student begins

OT Sessions

Some students may benefit from small group or private sessions with the Occupational Therapist. The Care Coordinator will be in touch with parents as needed.


HOW TUES/ THURS WORK


On Tuesdays and Thursdays we offer THEMED CLASSES or CAMPS or OUTDOOR WEEKS. Registration is required for all classes, camps and activities and events.

(A) THEMES CLASSES: Phoenix's unique "IN-THE-SCENE" education concept makes learning come alive! Resident Artist Jill Mann and her creative team carefully construct huge scenes in our 3000-square-foot Studio in which students of all ages can explore ideas, master APS outcomes and make memories that will last a lifetime!

Our themes for this year will be:

- **Bugs World**
- Victorian Era
- **Greatest Shows on Earth**
- **Ancient Rome**





- on the Alberta Program of Studies and is 2.5 hours. They include a variety of learning styles and activities. For example, a CORE class may include reading background information, answering comprehension questions, playing a related game, doing some math questions and creating a relevant science project or craft. Lunch is 30 mins and supervised by the school.
- 3. Material is presented at the advertised grade level of the class. Please register your child according to their WORKING grade level, not their registered level. (Ask your teacher for assistance if you do not know what their working grade level is.) If the class is too hard, they will be frustrated and if it is too easy, they will be bored.

WHAT EACH SUBJECT IS ABOUT!

We use the Alberta Program of Studies to plan each and every class. Classes for Grades 1-6 are thematic and include a variety of subjects, presentation styles and materials.

Literacy / Language Arts (LA) . . .

Literacy is viewing, representing, listening, speaking, reading and writing to construct and create meaning.

Social Studies (SOC) . . .

Students will build an understanding of Canada's multicultural, inclusive democracy and develop their own active, responsible global citizenship by exploring other countries - their food, culture, stories and way of life.

Science (SC) . . .

Science is the pursuit to understand the relationships within the living and nonliving universe. It means exploring and experimenting!

Numeracy / Math (M) . . .

Students will use inquiry, observation and math to analyze, measure and predict outcomes and solutions to real world problems.

Wellness (WELL) . . .

Wellness is about understanding the role of physical activity, nutrition and personal care in contributing to optimal health. Students will be learning about the nutrition, production and processing of food. They may do some cooking depending on the topic. Classes include a mix of gym time, kitchen time and classroom time.

Fine Arts (FA) . . .

Fine Arts is a way of giving expression to celebrating or challenging norms, traditions and values through visual art, drama and music.

Holidays . . .

We love to celebrate the various holidays. (Mostly the commercial ones that involve food!) Activities often include dress-up, food, music, crafts and more.

(B) CAMPS: Camps are loads of fun! They are high interest topics that engage learners, expand their skill sets and challenge them to try something new! (They are also pieces of the curriculum not covered in the themes.)

Research says that kids learn better in small groups where learning is tied in with real life and is messy! Camps take place in the various small classrooms on the Phoenix campus. This allows our team of amazing artists the chance to take down the studio and construct the next new exciting theme.

Please note camps are three weeks in length and run from 9:30 AM - 3:00 PM.

(C) OUTDOOR EDUCATION WEEKS

This is a three week period of programming dedicated to outdoor activities. The camps may include orienteering, survival skills, field trips, camping, laser tag, mini golf, or a special onsite guest.

HOW FRIDAYS WORK

Each day at Phoenix is different. Mondays to Fridays some components are virtual, Mondays are extras support, Tuesdays have pre-K to Grade 6 kids onsite, Wednesdays are dedicated to our teens, Thursdays have the pre-K to Grade 6 kids back onsite and Fridays . . . well, that is the day we fit in "all the other stuff" such as:

HOW FOOD & SUPERVISION WORKS

No parents will be allowed onsite unless they are required by an IPP. All classes will be full day and considered a cohort. As such we will provide out-of-class supervision for 15 minutes prior to class and after class for pick up and drop-off. Students in elementary grades require lunch supervision. The fee for all students is \$30 for the 6 week block of classes and \$15 for camps.

Your child will need indoor shoes as many of our programs may include gym time. Make sure you send a lunch, water bottle and a snack. No refrigeration or microwave is available for students. Please do not bring peanut or nut products. All items should be clearly marked with your child's name. There is no sharing of food.

Improper student behavior will not be tolerated and parents will be called to return immediately if necessary to pick up their child.


We are not a special needs school. If your child requires additional assistance beyond what Phoenix provides, you will be asked to stay in the class as your child's aide.

Please note, we are not an allergen-free zone! If your child has a severe allergy, you are required to send their epi-pen and teach them to self administer. We also ask that you remind and keep on reminding instructors of your child's allergies as many of our classes include food items, especially the Wellness classes.

IF THERE IS A DISCIPLINE PROBLEM



The instructor will **make your child aware** of the problem or issue and indicate what they should be doing differently. They will be given one additional warning.

After that, as you the parent are the primary and on-going educator of your child, **your assistance will be required**. Your child may be allowed to continue to participate in the class with your assistance.

If the behavior issue continues, you will be asked to **remove your child** from the class. We will not tolerate rude, disrespectful or unmanageable behavior.

If there is a persistent problem, your Learning Coach or the Principal will help implement strategies to help correct the behavior. Once corrected, your child may attend classes again at that time if appropriate.

In the Event of a Fire or Emergency

There are current fire extinguishers located throughout the building. Most rooms have at least one. Fire drills are conducted randomly throughout the year regardless of weather. We generally do not do school-wide drills, but rather, our fire procedure is reviewed with students each and every class, as students all have a varied schedule. Your children know they are to stay with their instructor, follow the instructor out to the muster point and to wait for you there.



<u>Parents:</u> ALL VISITORS MUST sign in at the front desk. This means parents, grandparents and siblings. Otherwise we may not know you are onsite during an emergency. If you are asked to leave the building in the event of a fire or Emergency, please go quickly to the nearest exit. These are marked on placards throughout the building. Take the children who are in your direct supervision and go outside to the muster point. We will meet you there.

<u>Muster point:</u> Is the big RED Phoenix sign. We will ask you to initial the class list to release the student under our supervision into your care.

Part of our safety plan is YOU! If you see a hazard, a stranger or are worried about something, please come and tell us!

Need a Band-Aid?

All staff have their First Aid certificates, so they can help! There are plenty of First Aid kits in the building – at the front desk, in the kinder room, in the kitchen, in the creation studio, in the gym and in the chopshop area. Plus, instructors have a small kit in their carts, even the field trip backpack has one! I think we have you covered!

Allergies

Phoenix CANNOT in any way guarantee that the school is allergen free. Anyone with an anaphylaxis allergy must keep their epi-pen with them. Parents are responsible for informing the school of their student's allergies and medical conditions. We ask that parents do not send common allergens to school.

Arrival and Departure

Drop off from 9:15 - 9:25 Pick-up from 3:05 - 3:15

In order to minimize congestion at the doorway during pick-up and drop- off, students will use separate entrances. But all meet in the SAFE ZONED AREA for pick up.

For Parking lot drop-off - Vehicles will enter from the 2nd ave entrance (behind the building) and exit using the west lot exit. Staff will supervise the lot during drop-off and pick-up times. Please keep the line moving!

Street parking is also an option, but please **do not** park on the west side of 19th street or on the corner of 19th and 2nd ave. 19th street is busy, has a bus stop and some industrial traffic. We love your kiddos and want them to be safe!

Beginning September 11, parking stalls are reserved for staff, handicap parking and those parents that are assisting their students in class. Parking passes will be issued for these families. The front door will be locked once classes are in session. Please ring the doorbell and someone will assist you.

Bins and Shoes

Phoenix provides bins for students to store their coats and shoes. Bins are located at each entrance. All staff, students and parents require indoor shoes while at Phoenix.

Class & Event Registration

Your program may include some classes and events. Registration is required for all classes, camps and activities. Additional classes, camps and events must be prepaid prior to participation. You may pay by Visa, MasterCard, etransfer, cash, cheque or debit. Any outstanding account balances will be charged to your credit card on file. Registration for classes is done through Bookwhen - https://bookwhen.com/calgary. Registration generally closes Friday at 2:00 PM for the next week's classes and activities. Can't make a class, camp or event, please call us to let us know - 403-265-7701. We are required to take attendance. PLease see our refund policy below.

Special Circumstances

Students on an IPP may have a modified attendance requirement. This must be discussed with your Learning Coach.

Class & Event Changes & Refunds

All class & event fees are non-refundable and non-transferrable. You have 48 hours from the time we receive your registration to make any changes or to cancel your booking. After 48 hours, you may switch

classes or camps once and if there is room, but a \$25.00 fee will apply. There is no refund for missed class, camps or events. However, if Phoenix cancels the class, camp or activity, we will issue a refund or credit.

Illness at Home

Please continue to be vigilant and screen your child before sending them to school. Students with any symptoms of any communicable illness, such as colds, COVID-19, flu, lice, stomach illness and chicken pox should stay home until they no longer have symptoms.

Illness While at School

Students who feel ill at school need to let their instructor know as soon as they begin to feel ill. School personnel are not permitted to give medication to students. Parents must be available to pick up their student as quickly as possible.

Students in grades K - 6 require lunch supervision. Phoenix provides lunch supervision. The fee for elementary students is \$5 per day that they are registered to attend. Kinder students do not pay a lunch supervision fee. Students must bring all of their own food, including snacks. There is no microwave or fridge for student use.

Parents on-site

Parents are not permitted to stay on-site while their child(ren) is in class. Instead, they will need to drop their child(ren) and pick them up at the designated time. The parking lot has been reconfigured to accommodate a drop-zone and fewer parking stalls. Staff will monitor the parking lot drop-off and pick-up times.

Parents of students on an IPP with a requirement for an aide, or a requirement for a parent to be on-site will be permitted to stay. There will be a designated space in the Learning Commons for these parents. Please do your best to keep younger siblings at home.

Parent Volunteers

We will require parent volunteers for lunch supervision and field trips. There is a Parent Volunteer Handbook and Application.

NEW: Personal Mobile Devices

Personal mobile devices (including smartwatches, smartphones, cell phones and headphones etc) will be restricted during instructional time for ECS to Grade 12 students. Students will be required to keep their devices in their backpacks.

Exceptions may be granted for health and medical needs or to support special learning needs. application for exceptions can be made to the principal or equivalent on a case-by-case basis. Phoenix may permit the use of personal mobile devices for educational purposes or other circumstances as determined by the principal or equivalent on a case-by-case basis.

Access to social media platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, etc may be restricted on the school network and devices. Further information regarding the roles and responsibilities of the school, parents and students can be found in the Student Handbook.

Consequences for non-compliance may result in a temporary loss of use and notification of parents.

School Supplies

Phoenix will provide all of the classroom supplies (pencils, crayons, scissors, glue, etc) needed for all classes. Please do not send these supplies from home.

Staying Clean and Healthy

Respiratory etiquette will follow Alberta Health Services guidelines, including encouraging and reminding students to cough and sneeze into their elbows.

Students will be encouraged to sanitize their hands when they enter and exit the building and classrooms

Students need to wash their hands:

- After using the restroom
- Before and after eating
- After sneezing and coughing into their hands

Masks are optional for all staff, parents, volunteers, visitors and students.

Student Attendance - Onsite Classes and Activities

Parents/guardians MUST telephone the school to explain and confirm the reason for a student's absence from onsite classes at 403-265-7701. Office staff arrive at the school by 8:30 a.m. and an answering machine is available.

Supervision of Students

While students are attending classes at Phoenix, they are supervised by Phoenix staff. Lunch supervision is required for students in grade 1 - 6. Fee applies.

Prompt pickup is required at the end of all programs. If you are late, please call to inform us so that your child does not worry. Please note: Babysitting charges (\$5.00) will apply for every 15 minutes, or part thereof after the stated program end time, that you are late. This will be charged to your credit card.

As members of the community, we recognize that we share the space and expect everyone at Phoenix to respect others property, place litter, recycling and compost in the appropriate containers and conduct themselves with courtesy and safety toward others.

Transportation

Phoenix does not provide transportation. Parents are required to transport their students to and from the school and to and from field-trips. There may be a transportation grant available from Alberta Education for parents in the kinder and Blended programs. This will be provided to parents in January of each school year. It cannot be applied to your outstanding fees directly.
